INCIDENTS OF INTEREST: NO ARREST:

July 27, 2008-Aggravated Assault w/gun-10:19pm-1000 blk of Connecticut-CN#080791144-

Officer Masilang and Officer Graves responded to 25/Connecticut regarding a shooting. Officers found a victim who had been shot once in the shoulder. The victim was unable to speak and was transported to S.F.G.H. where he was taken to surgery. Officers spoke with the attending ER doctor who told Officers that the victim was in critical condition and that he would be in the intensive care unit after surgery. Officers on the scene searched the area for bullet casings and other items of evidence, to no avail. No one else was injured during the shooting, no suspect was located.

July 27, 2008-Explosive Device Located-3:00pm-1300 blk of Palou-CN#080789763:

Officer Hope and Officer Neves responded to the 1300 blk of Palou regarding a hand grenade that was found. Officers spoke with the residents of the home who stated that their deceased father, who had been in the military, had left a grenade in a cabinet in the downstairs in-law apartment. Officers from the bomb squad responded and evacuated the block of residents for safety reasons. The device was taken by the bomb squad, who rendered it safe. No one was injured by the grenade during the incident.

Officers from Bayviews housing team responded to two separate locations regarding persons using bb guns to break windows in a car and in an apartment. FREE TREES FOR BAYVIEW RESIDENTS!

Dear Community Member:

Did you know that Friends of the Urban Forest (FUF) will be planting FREE TREES in Bayview Hunters Point on September 20th? Join your neighbors and enjoy this opportunity to network with each other while building community.

Since 1981, FUF along with community volunteers, has planted 2,498 trees in the Bayview. There are still thousands of potential spots for new street trees in the area. In the last three years alone, with the assistance of people like you, 628 trees have been planted just in the Bayview! Usually residents are asked to pay \$165 per tree. Right now special funding makes trees free for the Bayview. For the first time, we are also offering fruiting trees in

front yards, if there is space. FUF needs assistance promoting this program and getting people to sign up for free trees.

Please help us get the word out to your constituents communicating the benefit of trees, how easy and it is to plant them and that they are free.

Encourage them to join our community planting.

FUF recognizes that San Francisco's southeastern neighborhoods suffer from a lack of green spaces, tree coverage and community engagement. In these same neighborhoods proportionately high levels of air and noise pollution, asthma, crime, and/or poor academic performance among school children are also realities. Increased tree coverage achieved through community-led tree plantings will address each of these problems by improving the air quality, calming traffic, buffering noise, building community relations and pride, reducing crime and even improving concentration in children.

You are a community leader and we count on people like you to build advocates for our urban forest. Our Saturday tree plantings are wonderful mornings where neighbors get together for a fun and fulfilling activity, friends are made, lunch is shared and all participants leave with a feeling of pride in their community. If you have been thinking about leading an event this would be a great opportunity to engage your own group while expanding your reach. Your organization's reward for participating in the Bayview tree planting is the creation of a more livable city. I will be giving you a call next week to answer any of your questions. We look forward to spending the day with you in September!

Members of Bayview's plainclothes team were in the area of Potrero Hill when they saw an individual who they knew had a warrant for his arrest. This particular suspect is also a documented member of a gang in the Bayview District. Officers detained the suspect and placed him under arrest for the warrant.

July 28, 2008- Warrant Arrest, Cocaine Offense-3:53pm-Bayshore/Waterloo-CN#080793407:

Members of Bayview's plainclothes team were in the area of Bayshore Blvd when they received information that a wanted suspect was driving in the area. Officers stopped the vehicle and spoke with the driver, who was soon identified as the man they were looking for. The suspect was placed under arrest for the warrant and a search of the suspect revealed illegal narcotics.

Members of Bayview's Housing Team responded to Harbor Rd regarding an assault. Officer Ng and Whitfield responded to Armstrong regarding a citizen detaining a suspect. Officers met with the victim and two witnesses who were holding a suspect on the ground. The suspect was caught inside of the victim's vehicle, tearing out the stereo with a screwdriver. Officers placed the suspect under arrest without incident and transported him to Bayview Station for booking. No one was injured during the incident or the physical struggle to keep the suspect there until police arrived.

July 30, 2008-Robbery, W/other weapon-4:00pm-900 blk of Connecticut-CN#080801771:

Members of Bayview's Housing Team responded to Potrero Hill regarding a robbery. Officers met with and spoke to several victims who told officers that the suspect had robbed them of construction tools. The officers located the suspect and the items and placed him under arrest, after a brief struggle. The tools were returned to the victims and the suspect was taken to Bayview for booking. No one was injured during the robbery.

July 30, 2008-Firearm Loaded in Car, Possession by a Prohibited Person-9:09PM-1000 blk of Fitzgerald-CN#080800557:

Members of Bayview's plainclothes team were in the area of Fitzgerald when they saw a vehicle occupied by an individual, who is on probation with a search condition. Officers pulled up to the vehicle to conduct a probation search when officer Primiano located a firearm in the vehicle. All of the occupants of the vehicle were taken back to Bayview for an investigation. The parties were interviewed and it was determined that one suspect had possession of the weapon. That subject was arrested while the other two persons in the vehicle were released.

July 30, 2008-Aggravated Assault w/gun-Shooting into a vehicle-6:10pm-Osceola/LaSalle-CN#080802484:

Officer Hennessey and Officer Hunt were driving in the area of LaSalle when they heard gunshots. Officers drove further into the intersection and saw a van, with its back window broken, traveling at a high rate of speed, away from the area. Officers pulled the vehicle over and detained the two occupants. Additional officers responded to help and located a gun in the van. Two other suspects and an additional gun were located on the street where the shooting occurred. All suspects were placed under arrest and transported to Bayview Station. Members of the Gang Task Force responded to Bayview Station and took over the investigation. No one was injured during the shooting.
