### Public Interest

#### The Department of Child Support Services

The Department of Child Support Services (DCSS), previously a part of The District Attorney's Office, was created through Assembly Bill 196 and Senate Bill 542, in 1999. We are located in downtown San Francisco at 617 Mission Street and New Montgomery Street.

DCSS directly serves over 35,000 children of San Francisco's children residing in the City benefit from our services. We establish and enforce paternity, child support and medical insurance orders. We collect and distribute monies to families.

We pursue interstate reciprocal establishment and enforcement of child support orders in all 50 states, territories and many countries.

November 2003, our Department opened a branch office in the Bayview Hunters Point District, and in February 2002, a satellite office in the Mission-Excelsior Districts. Neighborhood residents can now open a new case or get information on how their case is progressing. We extend free full services at our main and branch offices, but we do not accept payments at the branch offices. Each of our offices has bi-lingual staff. We also have child support officers co-located at the Human Services Agency, 170 Otis Street

### In Summary:

- Department of Child Support Services is no longer part of the District Attorney's Office.
- Child support services are free of charge.
- The offices have bi-lingual Child Support Officers who speak Chinese and Spanish. 8:00 to 5:00 PM, Monday to Friday (open)
- No appointments are necessary at any of our three offices.

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Monday, May 21, 2007 - 10:58 AM - Traffic Violation, Evading Police - Oakdale Avenue and Ingalls Street - CS# 070 515 841 - Officer Lamma and Whitfield were on patrol when they saw a car driving past them. Officer Lamma saw the driver and knew that he had a suspended driver's license. In fact she arrested the individual in November and towed his car for the same offense. Officer Lamma turned on her lights and siren and attempted to pull the car over. However instead of pulling over, it sped off. Instead of risking public safety the officers decided not to chase the car. A "be on the lookout" was broadcast over the radio for other police cars. Officers Reynoso and Pasqua saw the car speeding through the district and ignoring traffic signs. They saw the car park on the 1100 block of Oakdale Avenue. Officer Reynoso and Pasqua caught up with the driver as he was getting out of the car. The man did not want to give up. As the officers approached him, he pushed the officer away. The man was quickly subdued and brought into custody. The man was booked for numerous traffic violations, battery on a police officer and had his car towed.

Monday, May 21, 2007 - 8:16 PM - Stay Away Order, Possession of Crack - CS# 070 517 994 - Officer Solares was on patrol with Officer Berge in the area of 3rd Street and Newcomb Avenue, when he saw a man they knew to have a stay away order. Officer Solares alerted Officer Berge and they took the man into custody. In the man's pocket was crack cocaine, the same offense that got the man the stay away order.

Monday, May 21, 2007 - 9:07 PM - Possession of a Firearm - Hunters Point Housing Project - CS# 070 518 118 - Officers Wise and Arquero were assigned to Bayview Station in our ongoing effort to suppress gun violence. This evening their efforts paid off. As they were on patrol in the Hunters Point Housing Complex they came upon an occupied car. When they made eye contact with one of the occupants, he quickly put his hand to his mouth. It is common for people to conceal objects such as narcotics in their mouths by swallowing them. When the officers got closer to the car they smelled marijuana coming from the car. They stopped and investigated.

As they were taking the three occupants out of the car one of them got out and started to run away. It calls to mind the adage, "A bird in hand was worth two in the bush." Well these officers had two in the hand and one that ran into the bush. They alerted other Bayview officers over the radio about the one that got away.

They searched the car and found a loaded 9MM pistol in it. The two remaining men blamed the presence of the gun on the subject that ran away. However, they could not remember his name. Nevertheless they were booked on possession of the handgun.

Tuesday, May 22, 2007 - 9:39 AM - Robbery, Arrest Made - Lane St and Quesada Ave - CS# 070 519 166 - Bayview Officers responded to the area of Lane Street and Quesada Avenue in response to a robbery in progress. 911 callers gave the description of the suspect that was robbing an elderly male. The responding officers found the suspect and were later able to find the victim. It was learned that the elderly gentleman had mailed a letter and was approached by the suspect who demanded his money. When the victim failed to give the man his money he was punched in the head, falling to the ground. The suspect took the victim's glasses and his wallet from his pocket. The victim suffered two cracked teeth, a laceration to his skull, and abrasions to his hand.

When the suspect was brought to the station he claimed that the elderly man attacked him. He was booked for robbery and the crack that was found in his pocket.

The officers were able to make a good arrest and a solid case because they received good information from the 911 callers as well as numerous witnesses coming forward and identifying the suspect.

Tuesday, May 22, 2007 - 11:13 PM - Homicide w/ gun - Bayshore and Augusta - CS# 070 522 460 - Bayview Officers responded to the scene of a homicide. A 31 year old San Francisco man was gunned down while seated in a car. Found on the victim was a large sum of cash and underneath him was a loaded handgun. The incident is currently under investigation.

Saturday, May 26th, 2007 - 9:10 and 9:20 PM - Robbery Series - Portola District - CS# 70 536 182 & 070 536 273 - In the span of ten minutes two people were robbed by gun point in the Portola District. The first incident took place at 9:10 PM at Dartmouth and Silliman Streets. The victim was walking in the area and was approached by four young men. One of the men lifted his shirt and displayed a chrome handgun and demanded the victim's Ipod. The victim fearing for his life gave the robbers what they asked for.

The second incident took place at 9:20 PM on Felton and Cambridge. The victim was approached by three males with the same description as the previous incident. One of the males asked the victim if he had any spare change. When he said no the male lifted his sweatshirt and showed the victim his gun. The remaining suspects removed the victim's wallet from his pocket, and took the victim's bag containing his laptop and Ipod.

Two people were detained at San Bruno and Burrows Streets. Both victim's were brought to the area, however they were unable to identify the people detained as their attackers.

The suspects were described as white, Latin, or mixed race males in their late teens and twenties. They were all wearing black hooded sweatshirts.
