Crimes and Law Enforcement
THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW
STATION:

Monday, April 30, 2007 at 9:49 PM - Assault, Aggravated with Gun. Hollister Avenue at 3rd Street. CS# 070-442-921 - Dispatch sent Officer Reiter and Officer Fong to Hollister Avenue at 3rd Street regarding a shooting. Apparently, three Personal Protective Service (PPS) Officers had on-viewed the shooting. Numerous units responded on scene to assist. When the Officers arrived they saw the victim lying on the ground inside the corner store. An ambulance arrived on scene and transported the victim to San Francisco General Hospital where he was treated for a qunshot wound to his right leq. The victim told the Officers that he was standing outside the corner store when he heard a qun shot. The victim said that he then felt a sharp pain in his leg. One of the PPS Officers told Officer Fong that he was driving in the area of Hollister Avenue at 3rd Street when he heard several shots being fired. The PPS Officer stated that he saw several male adults standing outside of the corner store. The PPS Officer stated that he saw one of the males fire a gun at the victim and then throw the gun underneath a parked vehicle. Sergeant Lee responded on scene and located and seized the qun from underneath the vehicle. Several units searched the area and detained three individuals that matched the description, but the PPS Officer stated that none of those detained was the shooter.

Tuesday, May 1, 2007 at 1:05 PM - Assault, Att. Homicide, with Gun. 1900 Block of 25th Street. CS# 070-444-610 - SFPD Housing Officers Sanders, Fowlie and Rodatos responded to the 1900 Block of 25th Street regarding a shooting. When they arrived they saw the victim laying in the street bleeding from what appeared to be gun shot wounds to each leg. The Officers secured the crime scene and began rendering medical aid. An ambulance arrived on scene and transported the victim to San Francisco General Hospital. Officer Fowlie rode in the ambulance with the victim to obtain additional information. The victim said that a female had dropped him off at 25th Street at Wisconsin Street. The victim said that the suspect then arrived in a vehicle and began shooting at him. The victim said he realized he had been shot so he pretended that he was dead so the suspect would leave. The victim refused to tell Officer Fowlie who the

female was that had dropped him off. The victim also refused to tell Officer Fowlie what the suspect looked like and the description of the vehicle he had gotten out of. Several units arrived at the crime scene and attempted to obtain additional witnesses to no avail.

Wednesday, May 2, 2007 at 6:06 AM - Robbery, Street or Public Place, W/Gun. Ardath Court. CS# 070-447-034 - Dispatch sent Officer Martinez and Officer Pashby to Ardath Court regarding a robbery with a gun. When the Officers arrived, they met with the victim who told them that she was walking to her vehicle, on her way to work, when she was approached by the suspect. The victim said that the suspect had approached her from behind and grabbed her purse from her hand. The victim said that she saw a black revolver in the suspect's hand. Fearing for her safety, the victim said that she let the suspect take her purse. The suspect then ran E/B on Ardath Court and down the stairs towards Bertha Lane. Numerous units arrived on scene and searched the area with negative results.

his patrol vehicle and detained the juvenile at gun point. Officer Dalton secured the handgun and informed Officer Shavers that it was a plastic toy gun. Officer Shavers asked the juvenile why he was walking around with a real looking toy gun and the juvenile replied, "I don't know." Officer Shavers and Officer Dalton transported the juvenile back to his residence and informed his mother of the situation. Officer Shavers confiscated the toy gun for safe keeping.

Saturday, May 5, 2007 at 2:15 PM - Cocaine, Base/Rock, Possession for Sale, Trespassing, Marijuana, Possession for Sale. Northridge Road at Harbor Road. CS# 070-459-001. While in plainclothes in an unmarked vehicle, Officer Alcaraz, Officer Berge and Officer Aherne were driving in the area of Northridge Road at Harbor Road when they observed four individuals standing in front of one of the residences. An arrest search revealed two zip lock baggies with suspected marijuana. The male was transported to Bayview Station where he was booked. Officer Berge hand delivered the suspected narcotics to 850 Bryant Street.

Francois Blvd. CS# 070-461-147. Dispatch sent Officer Bates and Officer Wise to Terry A Francois Blvd. regarding a fight with baseball bats. Upon arrival, the Officers saw the victim being attended to by his friends. victim appeared to have been beaten about his head and body and was bleeding from his head and face. Due to his condition, the victim was unable to answer any questions. An ambulance arrived on scene and began to treat the victim. An anonymous witness told Officer Bates that the victim and his cousin were yelling racial slurs at three males and that led to a physical altercation. The witness said that one of the males then grabbed a baseball bat and began swinging it at both the victim and his cousin. The victim was transported to San Francisco General Hospital where he was treated for blunt trauma injuries to his head and body. Officer Bates and Officer Wise followed the ambulance to SFGH. At SFGH, Officer Bates made contact with the victim's cousin, who had transported himself to SFGH prior to the Officers arriving on scene. The victim's cousin stated that he saw his cousin getting jumped by three males. The cousin stated that he did not know why they were fighting but he had tried to help his cousin when he got struck on the left side of his head by a baseball bat. Neither of the victims could provide the Officers with any additional leads and or suspects.

Sunday, May 6, 2007 at 1:11 PM - Stay Away Order Violation, DV related, Methamphetamine Offense. 600 Block of Hudson. CS# 070-462-333. Officer Berge, Officer Alcaraz and Officer Aherne were working in the plain clothes capacity when they were informed that a male had violated his stay away order. The male had been ordered to not contact his ex-girlfriend. It was reported at Bayview Station that the male had called his ex-girlfriend several times in the past few days. Both the male and the Officers were present in court when the order was issued. The Officers drove to the known work address of the male. Upon arriving they observed the male standing in the rear of the garage. Officer Alcaraz approached the male and told him he was under arrest for violating the stay away order. The male spontaneously stated, "I never called her." An arrest search revealed a plastic baggie containing a large amount of an off-white crystal like substance, suspected methamphetamine. The male was booked at Bayview Station. Officer Alcaraz hand carried the suspected narcotics to 850 Bryant Street.
