Responding Officers met with the victim, who fortunately was not shot. The victim stated that as he was walking south on Brussels Street, a slow moving car approached him. As the car passed him the passenger fired two shots from what appeared to be a handgun. A search of the area was performed for suspects, witnesses, bullet holes, or casings with negative results. Festa and Martin were riding on the 1600 block of Palou Avenue when they spotted a young man walking with a laptop computer. The computer drew the attention of the officers for it was not held in a case or a bag. Noticing the presence of the officers, the individual tried to duck in the recess of a garage. The actions of the individual made the officers concerned that something was wrong and they questioned the man. They learned that he had an outstanding warrant and brought him to the station. They contacted the customer support center of the computer manufacturer and gave them the serial number. It was learned that the owner reported the computer stolen to the help desk. The young man was booked for his warrant and possession of stolen property. The owner was not reached until the next day and the Police Department is in the process of getting the computer back to him.

Thursday, August 2, 2007 - 6:20 PM - Warm Water Cove - CS# 070 783 731 - Plainclothes Officers were in the area of Warm Water Cove Park when they spotted a Mission District resident spray paint a wall that borders Warm Water Cove at the basin of 24th Street. The subject was detained, identified, and his paint was confiscated. He was released and the case is being reviewed for prosecution.

Friday, August 3, 2007 - 9:56 AM - Possession of a Firearm by a Prohibited Person - CS# 070 784 193 - Officers Izaguirre and Paul were on patrol in the area of the Harbor and Northridge Public Housing Projects. As they passed a moving vehicle they detected the odor of burning marijuana. They stopped the vehicle and contacted the passengers. Although the driver had a medicinal marijuana card; it did not allow him to smoke marijuana and operate a motor vehicle. Because the driver was on probation, a search was performed. Inside the car was a loaded handgun. Registration records showed that the gun was stolen from Hayward. The driver and the passenger were booked for firearm violations, gang affiliations and probation violations.

The plainclothes officers stopped him and detected a strong smell of an alcoholic beverage on him. When the officers told the driver that he was detained for drunk driving, the driver started his truck and drove away. He was stopped due to traffic at King and Third Streets and taken into custody. Preliminary breath tests show that the driver was in excess of twice the legal limit of alcohol. The driver, from San Francisco, was booked for drunk driving and numerous traffic violations.
