Crimes and Law Enforcement

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Monday, April 9, 2007 - 6:45 AM - Hot Prowl Burglary - Potrero Hill Housing - 100 block of Dakota - CS# 070 361 462 - Bayview Officers responded to a housing unit in the Potrero Hill Housing Complex on a report of an home invasion robbery. Officer Shavers and Altofer met with the victim, a 9-year-old boy. He told the police that he was startled awake when he found an armed gunman rummaging through his room. During the event the gunman lifted his mattress as the boy was lying on it and rummaged through the drawers of his bureau. The gunman left the room and continued to ransack the rest of the unit. The boy, thinking the gunman left the house, walked out of his room only to find the gunman down the hall. The gunman pointed the gun at the boy's face and said, "Don't say anything." The boy also saw a second person acting as a lookout. The suspects left the home and the boy called 911.

The boy's mother returned home. She said that she locked the door to her home to go to work. It was evident that the suspects kicked the door open. The suspects were able to steal a purse and its contents.

The first suspect was described as a black male 20-30 years old, 6'00" 220 pounds, wearing a black jacket and blue jeans. The suspect acting as a lookout is a black male 5'9", 160 pounds wearing a black knit cap, black jacket, and blue jeans.

Monday, April 9, 2007 - 4:13 PM - Carjacking - Northridge and Kiska Roads - CS# 070 363 565 - A San Leandro man was carjacked after the two female companions he was with lured him with the promise of smoking marijuana. The victim was with the two young girls when one of them asked if he wanted to smoke weed with some of her cousins. He said yes and the girls brought him to the housing complex on Northridge Road. When he got there two male subjects got in the rear seat of the car. One of the subjects pointed a gun at the back of the victim while the other one rummaged through his pockets. Everyone got out of the car. The victim, fearing for his life, fled the scene leaving his car behind and called 911.

Descriptions of the suspects were broadcast over the air for responding

units. Police were able to detain the two females after they were seen getting out of the victim's car. The two girls, both juveniles were booked for conspiracy and robbery charges.

Bayview officers received an anonymous tip about the outstanding suspects. Officer Scott prepared a photo line-up containing six photographs, which in police jargon is called a "six pack". The victim positively picked out the two young men that were involved.

The next day, Bayview plainclothes officers found the gunman in the incident on the 700 block of Kirkwood Avenue. He was easy to spot because he was wearing the same clothing. The suspect, also a juvenile was booked at YCG.

Tuesday, April 10, 2007 - 12:23 PM - Possession of Narcotics for Sales, Expired Registration - 1300 block of Illinois - CS# 070 366 553 - Officers Lamma and Gallo were on patrol on Illinois Street when they spotted a Winnebago with expired registration. A computer check confirmed this however; in the window was a temporary registration sticker. A closer look revealed that the sticker belongs to GMC truck. The registered owner was on scene and placed under arrest for displaying false registration. In a search of the Winnebago, was methamphetamine, hash, and marijuana as well as scales and packaging material indicating that the narcotics were for sale. The additional felony narcotics charges were placed on the woman.

Wednesday, April 11, 2007 - 1:43 PM - Domestic Violence, Assault with a car - CS# 070 370 667 - Bayview Officers responded to the 100 block of Gilman Avenue on a report that a woman just hit a man and a child with her car. The caller then stated that the driver got out of the car and started to kick the man that she had knocked down with her car. Officer Booth, of CSI was in the area and stopped the woman as she turned the corner. Inside the suspect's car was the child that she struck with the car.

The man victim was located and an ambulance was summoned. He initially was reluctant to say what happened as well as intoxicated. A witness was located who said that as the man the suspect were arguing. The man was accompanied by and a young girl and was arguing with the suspect as she sat in her car. The man and the girl walked away and in front of the car. The suspect gunned the engine and began to drive away. The witness said that the woman intentionally steered her car into the path of the man, striking him in the side and knocking him and the young girl down.

The woman began to drive away but made a u-turn and stopped by the downed man. The woman got out of the car and started to kick the man in his midsection and head. The woman grabbed the young girl and placed her in

the back of the car and began to speed off before she was intercepted by Officer Booth.

The young girl said that the woman ran down her daddy and then ran over her foot. It was learned that the woman and the man had a long term relationship. The girl was the daughter of the victim from a previous relationship. Remarkably the girl was not injured, nor was her father.

The woman was booked on domestic violence charges, assault with a deadly weapon charges, kidnapping, and causing traumatic injury to a child. The girl was brought to her grandmother's house nearby.

Wednesday, April 11, 2007 - 11:24PM - Methamphetamine Possession - Tennessee Street and 25th Street - CS# 070 372 522 - Plainclothes Officers Berge and Lew were in the area of 25th and Tennessee Streets when they saw a man peering into parked cars in the area. The residents and business owners are well aware of the car break-ins in the area and these officers believed that they were witnessing such an act. They stopped the man and asked him his name. The man denied being on probation however the computer told otherwise. They searched the man and found a blue container. In the container was methamphetamine. When asked why he lied about his probation status he pointed to the drugs and said, "That is why." He later apologized for lying and asked the officers, "You understand though, right?" Also in the man's possession was a digital scale, which is indicative that the man possessed the narcotics for sale. The man, a resident of the Mission District was booked for narcotics and the probation violation.

Saturday, April 14, 2007 - 11:45PM - Parolee at Large - Newhall and Quesada - CS# 070 382 634 - A parolee at large was arrested after nearly being caught in the act. Officer Bates and Hernandez saw the vehicle parked and approached it. They saw the parolee in the front seat and a woman bent over the console. Believing that they may be witnessing an act of prostitution unfolding they detained them. A computer check revealed the wanted parolee's status. He was taken into custody and booked for the warrant. Because the officers could not prove that a sexual act took place or that money changed hands the woman was released.

Sunday, April 15, 2007 - 6:50PM - Malicious Mischief - 500 block of Michigan Street - CS# 070 385 020 - Three San Francisco residents are in custody after two witnesses saw them smash numerous truck taillights with a piece of metal. Witnesses say that three were in a pickup truck that had distinct markings on the side and were following them. Officer Rodgers and Rodriguez saw the truck and detained the three vandals. Because the damage to these vehicles is in excess of \$400.00 they were booked for felony
