Tuesday, March 27, 2007 - 8:15 PM - Robbery w/gun - 800 Block of Rhode Island Street - CS# 070 317 352 - A shop owner just returned from emptying his garbage when he was approached by an armed gunman who pointed a gun at his head and told the man, "Open up the register." The storekeeper claimed that he did not know how to open the register so the gunman pressed a bunch of buttons to get it open. He fled the scene with the money from the register. The shopkeeper said that another person was standing outside, possibly as a lookout.

A witness told police that he saw a bunch of males outside, possibly of Latin or White descent. He later described one of the males as running from the store and jumping into a white Suburban, with tinted windows, and chrome rims. CSI was brought to the scene to attempt to find fingerprints.

Wednesday, March 28, 2007 - 1:09 AM - Weapons Arrest, Narcotics Arrest - 3400 block of Alemany - CS# 070 317 910 - Officers Wise and Batchelder were acting on a tip that a male might be in possession of narcotics and weapons. The officers went to the man's house and spoke with him. In the course of the conversation the officers learned that the man was on probation from San Mateo County and subject to a warrantless search. In the man's car the officers found methamphetamine. They also searched the man's garage and found a cache of weapons. In total they found 11 rifles, 2 shotguns, and 1 pistol. There was also over 350 rounds of ammunition. Because the man is a convicted felon having these weapons, constitutes a felony. Each firearm is a felony charge.

told the officers that he was working in a unit on the second floor when he heard a window break. The foreman told the officers that as he looked out the window onto 3rd Street, to see if he could figure out how the window broke, he heard a second window break. The foreman said that he then ran out of the unit, towards the scaffolding that was set up in the courtyard, when he heard a third window break. This building is under construction and all the units have newly installed windows. The foreman said that he asked the other workers on site if they had heard anything, but unfortunately they had their air compressors and stereos on. The foreman stated that he searched the entire third floor of the building but could not locate any possible suspects. Due to the apparent lack of physical evidence, Crime Scene Investigations (CSI) was not notified. Officer Shavers gave the foreman a follow up form and advised him to contact his insurance company.

Saturday, March 31, 2007 at 8:21 AM - Cocaine, Base/rock Offense; Marijuana Offense; Cocaine, Transportation. 3rd Street at Palou Avenue. CS# 070 330 746 - Officers Barcojo and Altorfer were in full police uniform driving a marked police vehicle in the area of 3rd Street and Palou Avenue when they observed a vehicle driving the opposite direction, traveling at a high rate of speed. Officer Altorfer made a U-turn, caught up to the vehicle and effected a traffic stop. Officer Altorfer approached the driver of the vehicle and informed him of the reason for the traffic stop. As Officer Altorfer was speaking with the driver he smelled a pungent odor of what he believed, due to his training and experience, to be burned marijuana. Officer Altorfer asked the driver if there was any marijuana in the vehicle and the driver stated that there was some partially burned marijuana cigarettes in the ashtray. Officer Altorfer asked the driver if he had a legal reason for having the marijuana and the driver said "no." The driver was detained pending further investigation and asked to step out of the vehicle. Officer Altorfer searched the driver in an attempt to locate additional contraband, but could not find any. Officer Altorfer then searched the vehicle and found a brown pill bottle underneath the arm rest. Inside the bottle were three off-white colored rocks. Officer Altorfer believed the off-white colored rocks to be suspected cocaine base. Officer Altorfer also located five partially burned suspected marijuana cigarettes inside the ashtray, as the driver had previously stated. The driver was placed under arrest for possession and transportation of narcotics. Officers Barcojo and Altorfer attempted to locate a legal parking space for the driver's vehicle, but since none was available, the vehicle was towed to Auto Return. The driver was transported to Bayview Station where he was later booked. Officer Altorfer and Officer Barcojo hand carried the narcotics to the narcotics drop box at 850 Bryant Street.
