Crimes and Law Enforcement
THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW
STATION:

Tuesday, December, 26, 2006 - 6:45 PM - Crack Offense - 1500 Revere Avenue - CS# 061 366 429 - On Christmas evening a local resident complained to Bayview Plainclothes Officers that people use the vestibule of her apartment to smoke crack. The resident even identified one of the participants by name. This evening the plainclothes officers investigated and found a woman sitting outside the apartment. Officer Coleman, who had his police star clearly visible, approached her and asked if she was smoking crack. The woman said yes and that she had a crack pipe. She showed it to Officer Coleman and was placed under arrest. In her pockets were additional pieces of crack cocaine.

The resident opened the gate and showed the officers the woman she had identified. That woman was passed out on her stairs and at her feet was a crack pipe. Officers woke her up and then placed her under arrest. The first woman was booked for possession of crack and paraphernalia. The second woman was citied for possession of narcotics paraphernalia, because it is only a misdemeanor.

Wednesday, December, 27, 2006 - 4:00 PM - Possession of a Loaded Firearm, Possession of Marijuana - Northridge and Harbor Road - CS# 061 369 284 - Plainclothes Officers spotted two cars that were wanted in connection with a robbery series. In the vehicles were known members of the "Big Block" gang that frequent the area. When the cars saw that the police were in the area, One of the vehicles made a hasty retreat while the other one stopped in the middle of the road and feigned mechanical trouble in hopes to block the path of the police. But they were not so lucky. The police got around the road block and caught up to the retreating vehicle.

Inside the vehicle was a large quantity of marijuana. When police made the discovery the driver said, "I have a cannabis card." When asked what his ailment was, he stated, "There is nothing wrong with me, I just have it so you will not jack me." In the grass next to the vehicle was a freshly discarded 9 mm handgun.

Both occupants of the vehicle were taken into custody. An investigation was conducted and it was learned that the handgun came from that vehicle. CSI is conducting DNA analysis to confirm it.

It should be noted that one of these gang members lives in Daly City and the another one lives in the Sunset District.

Wednesday, December 27, 2006 - Stay Away Order and Probation Violation - 3rd Street and McKinnon - CS# 061 369 398 - Third Street Beat Officers Dalton and McPherson, advised a woman that loiters in the area of 3rd Street and McKinnon, that she has a stay order from that location and would be arrested if she did not comply. In this season of giving, she was given numerous breaks and advised that she would be arrested. Once Christmas had past, Officer Dalton saw her standing on the corner again. This time he arrested her. Also in her possession was heroin. The woman, who is on probation, was booked for the stay away order violation and possession of heroin.

Thursday, December 28, 2006 - 10:43 PM - Parole Violation - Potrero Hill Housing - CS# 061 373 678 - Two parolees at large were returned State Prison this evening. Plainclothes officers Aherne, Alcaraz, Lew, and Benzinger, observed saw the parolees while on patrol in the Potrero Hill Housing Projects. They observed them go into a unit and knocked on the door. The police announced their presence but all they could hear was the muffled sounds of commotion. The officers forced entry and saw people fleeing out the window out back. Unknown to the criminals, officers were eagerly awaiting them.

The parolees who were arrested also had crack cocaine in their pockets, were booked.

Saturday, December 30, 2006 - 9:52 AM - Possession of Narcotics for Sale - 1500 block of Shafter - CS# 061 378 167 - Officers Davis and Martinez were on patrol on Shafter Avenue when they saw a red car driving in the area. They recalled a 911 call earlier in the day that described that same car as being involved in selling narcotics. The officers ran the license plate and saw that the license plate registration tab did not match DMV records. A traffic stop was performed and its driver had a suspended driver's license. When a search of the car was performed, a cache of crack and marijuana were found. The man, who lives in the Sunnydale District and is on probation, was booked for numerous narcotics charges, driving offenses, and violating his probation.

Sunday, December 31, 2006 - 10:37 PM - Possession of a Firearm - 3rd Street and Underwood Avenue - CS# - New Years Eve ended prematurely for two teenagers. Officer Preston and Berge spotted the young men when they were

standing in the middle of the roadway. The officers stopped to investigate this seemingly harmless violation. They attempted to detain both of the males but one continued to walk away. He was detained.

One of the males held his hands in his waistband and refused to move them. With the aid of another officer the subject was placed into handcuffs. Officer Preston began to search his waistband and felt the handle of a gun. Officer Preston told the other officers that he had found a gun on the person. The young man then stated, "We both have guns."

The second suspect was taken into custody and a gun was found in his pant pocket.

Both young men were booked for weapons possession. One of the young men was reported missing in Alameda County. The other male is on probation and has a warrant for battery on a police officer.
