**Captain's Message:**

**Congratulations to Officer Kathy Pubill who served her last day today as a member of Ingleside Station! Officer Pubill has spent the last 12 years of her career at Ingleside and for the last few years serving the community as the Permit, Events and Code Enforcement Officer. Officer Pubill tested and was selected as a member of the Department's Crime Scene Investigations Unit (CSI). She will now respond and process crime scenes throughout the City. She will be missed by the Ingleside Officers and our Community.**

**Congratulations to Officer James Trail of our Housing Unit. On Wednesday, October 14, 2009, Officer Trail was awarded the Departments 2<sup>nd</sup> highest award, the Silver Medal of Valor, for his role approximately 4 years ago in a shootout on Alemany Blvd involving a very violent and extremely dangerous wanted fugitive. Officer Trail's actions were truly heroic!**

**Ingleside's 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Police Activities League Basketball Team played last night at St. Mary's Gym against St. Mary's team. Although we lost 28 to 4, the team played a good game and fought a good fight! Officers Anderson and Valenzuela filled in as coaches.**

**We conducted an Operation Safe Muni enforcement operation yesterday at 30<sup>th</sup> and Mission. Within an hour and a half, we issued 15 citations, mostly for fare evasion.**

**Many people have asked me how our plan has been going on Muni. Police officers have been boarding the bus and asking for proof of payment. They have been issuing citations when people cannot produce evidence that the fare was paid. Foot beat Officer Lundy reports that when he now boards a bus on Mission Street, many people quickly leave and others automatically hold up their fast passes.**

**Fiesta on the Hill is this weekend on Cortland Avenue on Sunday the 18<sup>th</sup> beginning at 11:00 a.m. I hope to see you there.**

**Supervisor Avalos and I will be hosting a meeting regarding the Excelsior Homicide on Wednesday, October 21, 2009 from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. at Coleman Advocates, 459 Vienna Street. A representative from our Homicide Detail will be there and we will discuss crime issues and hear concerns from the Community. Please note that Lt. Cherniss will be filling in for me at our monthly Community meeting the day before, Tuesday October 20<sup>th</sup>.**

**Correction!!!! The other day I indicated that the Ingleside District has had 7 homicides year to date. This total is district wide. The Excelsior has only suffered 1 homicide this year.**

**There will be a candlelight vigil for the homicide victim this Sunday, October 18, 2009 at 8:00 pm. The vigil will be held at Athens and Excelsior. I hope to meet you there!**

## October is National Crime Prevention Month



This is a perfect time to take the extra steps in practicing safety awareness by learning more about crime prevention and the steps you can take to make yourself, your family and your property safer. ### *Halloween Safety Tips:*

Costumes should fit correctly so kids won't trip on them. Wear light-colored costumes to be seen at night.

Kids should not try to Trick or Treat by themselves. They should go with an adult and a group of friends.

Map out where you and your friends will be going. Visit only the well-lighted houses.

Try to Trick-or-Treat while it is still light out; always bring a flashlight, it may get dark. Wear a reflective costume or stickers.

Pick well-lighted streets. Walk on the sidewalks. Do not take shortcuts or alleys!

Only accept candy at a person's front door. Do not go inside of a house or into someone's car.

Have a back-up plan in case you get separated from your group. Carry a cell phone, walkie-talkie or money for a pay phone, and the number of a trusted adult.

Don't eat any candy until you get home. Have an adult check to make sure there are no tricks in your treats! If there is any suspicious candy, contact your local police station.
