Twenty SFUSD high school students, ages 14-18 will participate in internships at eleven innovative San Francisco-based (sf.citi member) technology companies: Pathbrite, Relevance, Black Girls Code, Sincerely, Cloudera, Stumbleupon, Unified Social, Appallicious, MsJones Design, Exygy, Nudge Technology, and Shasta Crystals Inc. The eight-week program begins June 21st with a Pathbrite digital portfolio orientation.

As last year, each student will receive a \$1,250 internship stipend funded by a \$25,000 sf.citi grant.
