Mayor's Office, City Departments, and Local Nonprofits Host 4th Annual Christmas Tree Giveaway in Bayview-Hunters Point and Western Addition

Mayor London N. The Christmas tree giveaway in the Western Addition will take place **Monday, December 23 from 2:00PM to 4:00PM at the Fillmore/Turk Street mini park**. Trees will be distributed at **3:00pm**. A Celebrity Meet and Greet and Toy Giveaway will take place from **4:00pm to 6:00pm at the Fillmore Heritage Center (1330 Fillmore Street).** This event will feature games, arts and crafts, snacks and beverages and guest appearances by Baron Davis, Matt Barnes, Stephen Jackson and others.

The SFHA worked with The Guardsmen, a Bay Area-based nonprofit organization which works to improve the lives of at-risk youth, to provide trees to residents. Swinerton donated additional materials for the tree stands

which crews from City Build will be assembling.
