Gordon Graham, a risk management expert, author, and speaker who coined the phrase "If it's predictable, it's preventable," reminded us in a leadership seminar to always participate in the airplane safety briefing before takeoff, so as to be ready if the unthinkable happens. Seizing the opportunity on a recent flight, I heard the United flight attendant announce, "If the oxygen mask comes down from the overhead bin, put the mask on yourself first before assisting others." Both Graham's and the flight attendant's words reflect the importance of enhancing personal capacity, so that we may be able to help others. Simply put, an empty well gives no water. This month's community meeting, held at Ingleside Police Station from 7-9PM on Tuesday, June 19, will focus on training that will enhance personal, family, neighborhood, and community capacity and readiness. This "pre-NERT" training will be co-presented with the SF Fire Department's Neighborhood Emergency Response Team instructors. If you have already been NERT certified, bring an interested neighbor or friend for a comprehensive review of preparedness principles that will inspire them to seize upon future trainings (like the full NERT course) and events (like NEN's Neighborfest/Block Party program). Come get the knowledge, skills, and ability for yourself and your family's resilience, so that you may serve and protect your neighbors, neighborhoods, and community in times of stress.

This month, we are featuring, honoring, respecting, and celebrating the amazing accomplishments of the "Friends of Kenny Alley."

Kenny Alley, a public passage and stairway that connects London Street to Mission Street between France Avenue and Italy Avenue, appeared on San Francisco maps as early as 1911. Recognizing the need to beautify and rehabilitate the space, Friends of Kenny Alley was organized in 2015. Since then, they have installed a mural, mosaics, new signage, and planter boxes (amongst other things). Members of this group also serve the Excelsior community as members of EDIA, OMMRA, EAG, Excelsior Collaborative, and others.




WEDNESDAYS IN JUNE AT EXCELSIOR WORKS




