Gordon Graham, a risk management expert, author, and speaker who coined the phrase "If it's predictable, it's preventable," reminded us in a leadership seminar to always participate in the airplane safety briefing before takeoff, so as to be ready if the unthinkable happens. Seizing the opportunity on a recent flight, I heard the United flight attendant announce, "If the oxygen mask comes down from the overhead bin, put the mask on yourself first before assisting others." Both Graham's and the flight attendant's words reflect the importance of enhancing personal capacity, so that we may be able to help others. Simply put, an empty well gives no water. This month's community meeting, held at Ingleside Police Station from 7-9PM on Tuesday, June 19, will focus on training that will enhance personal, family, neighborhood, and community capacity and readiness. This "pre-NERT" training will be co-presented with the SF Fire Department's Neighborhood Emergency Response Team instructors. If you have already been NERT certified, bring an interested neighbor or friend for a comprehensive review of preparedness principles that will inspire them to seize upon future trainings (like the full NERT course) and events (like NEN's Neighborfest/Block Party program). Come get the knowledge, skills, and ability for yourself and your family's resilience, so that you may serve and protect your neighbors, neighborhoods, and community in times of stress.



## The Friends of Kenny Alley



This month, we are featuring, honoring, respecting, and celebrating the amazing accomplishments of the "Friends of Kenny Alley."

Kenny Alley, a public passage and stairway that connects London Street to Mission Street between France Avenue and Italy Avenue, appeared on San Francisco maps as early as 1911. Recognizing the need to beautify and rehabilitate the space, Friends of Kenny Alley was organized in 2015. Since then, they have installed a mural, mosaics, new signage, and planter boxes (amongst other things). Members of this group also serve the Excelsior community as members of EDIA, OMMRA, EAG, Excelsior Collaborative, and others.

Two customers, a man and a woman, caught the attention of Safeway security personnel as the pair unsurreptitiously placed several bottles of liquor into pockets of their clothing, and quickly left the store without paying. The suspects, accompanied by a small child, were stopped by security officers outside the store and asked to return, and pay for the items. Instead of complying, one of the suspects punched a security officer in the face and then boarded an elevator to the upstairs parking level where they escaped. 9:58pm Mission & Silver Aggravated Assault

A fight on a Muni bus prompted dispatch to send Ingleside officers Burke and Cortez-Cendejas to the intersection of Mission and Silver to investigate. When they arrived on scene, Ingleside Sergeants Hoang and Young were already there and were interviewing a victim who was bleeding profusely from a wound to his head. The officers summoned an ambulance which transported the victim to San Francisco General Hospital for treatment. The driver of the #14 Muni bus told the officers he was driving south bound on Mission when he noticed the victim being attacked by three other male passengers. The driver stopped the bus at Silver, and the suspects exited the bus and fled in an unknown direction. A car with illegally tinted windows caught the attention of Ingleside officer Hardy who followed the car as it did a short tour of several streets in the Excelsior Neighborhood. Officer Hardy stopped the vehicle on the 1200 block of Alemany, and made contact with the male driver and female passenger. The unlicensed driver had previous convictions for several vehicle code violations and a domestic violence restraining order. Even more troubling was a loaded handgun hidden under the driver's seat along with a ski mask and two cell phones in the center console. 2:38am 600 Blk. Morse Hot Prowl Burglary

Quick work by Ingleside officers resulted in the arrest of a burglary suspect. Ingleside officers Ahern and Duran were dispatched to a report of a burglary on the 600 block of Morse. While in route, the officers spotted a man matching the description of the suspect walking north bound on Mission Street, near Concord. Ahern and Duran broadcast that information and proceeded to the victim's home. They talked to the woman victim and viewed surveillance video showing the suspect struggling with the victim while trying to wrestle away her purse as she entered her garage. Meanwhile, Ingleside officers George and Billings detained the suspect who was brought back to the scene of the crime. The victim positively identified the suspect as the man who stole her purse. A man with several previous arrests for theft at the Safeway store, again entered the establishment to go shopping for free. He picked up meat, treats, and toys for his dog, then tried to exit the store without paying. This time security personnel stopped the suspect. An argument between two men resulted in one of the pair suffering severe stab wounds and the other arrested for the crime. Ingleside officers Casey and Scott were the first officers dispatched to the scene and found the victim, suffering from stab wounds to the neck, back, and arms. The victim was being treated by ambulance personnel. He was quickly transported to San Francisco General for emergency treatment. Witnesses pointed out the suspect who was standing nearby in a doorway. He told the officers that he stabbed the victim in self-defense. Video of the attack shows the pair arguing at a bus stop and then the suspect chasing the victim around the bus stop before stabbing him. A search of the suspect's clothing revealed the knife used in the attack. He was arrested and driven to Ingleside Station for booking. Report number: 180458537

Ingleside officers Brown and Sherman were on routine patrol when they spotted a Prius reported stolen from the day before. The two men inside were quickly arrested and placed in custody. The Prius' owner responded to the scene to recover the car. He told the officers that he thought the suspects gained access to his car by breaking a rear window and found a spare ignition key in the glove box which they used to steal the car. 7:30pm Geneva & Moscow Robbery w/gun

Two suspects who robbed and threatened a concession stand owner were quickly apprehended by police. The owner said the two men approached the stand and asked for the price of an ice cream. The owner told them two dollars. The pair then tried to steal potato chips but couldn't because the snacks were chained to the stand. Next, one of the suspects reached into his waistband and said "I have a gun. Give me the ice cream". The concession owner didn't comply even though he was scared for his life. The pair then grabbed a can of Sprite and walked away. Ingleside officers Camarra and Grabbe arrived and broadcast a description of the pair of suspects. A short time later the officers, along with Sergeant O'Neal, detained the pair as they were leaving the park. One was arrested and transported to Ingleside Station and the other was released at the scene. Report number: 180455743

11:41pm 2700 Blk. San Bruno Ave. Firearms

A year-long surveillance of man bragging on social media about his extensive collection of firearms and ammunition paid off when Ingleside officers Jensen and Clayton spotted the suspect walking southbound on Bacon Street near San Bruno Avenue. They stopped the suspect and asked if he had any weapons on him. He said he had a handgun in a holster on his waist. He consented to a search of his vehicle and his nearby home. In his car, the officers found a high capacity magazine underneath the front seat. A search of his home revealed eight rifles and handguns along with high capacity magazines, methadone pills, tools, rifle scopes, ammo boxes, body armor, rifle cases, and other items. He was transported to the County Jail and charged with the appropriate violations. Report number: 180456280

### **Operation Kaboom**

Why: To efficiently and effectively knockout those locations where illegal fireworks are ignited throughout the Ingleside District, so that we maintain peace, calm, and the quiet enjoyment of life for adults, children, and pets.

What: July  $4^{th}$  is prime time in the Ingleside Police District for illegal fireworks to be ignited between the hours of 5PM and 2AM. While 911 is the main number for emergencies in progress, including fires, serious injuries, and other criminal offenses, the non-emergency number, (415) 553-0123, had been the primary source of communication regarding fireworks complaints. This number has been inundated with calls regarding the sound of fireworks, making it harder for residents to contact police (and generate an effective response) when there is specific information regarding suspects and locations that are causing the biggest fireworks disturbances.

How: Emergency Dial: 911

Non-Emergency Dial: (415) 553-0123

Operation Kaboom Dial: (415) 404-4052 when you can see and describe the suspect(s) at a certain location where illegal fireworks are being ignited. An SFPD PSA (Police Service Aide) will be staffing the line. Be prepared to provide the exact location and description of the subjects. The Operation Kaboom Task Force (OKTF) will have a small group of officers who will respond to specifically abate, admonish, and even arrest if the circumstance warrant. The OKTF may be delayed due to the volume of calls and may be needed if a shooting, riot, or other situation requiring an emergency police response occurs that takes precedence.




## WEDNESDAYS IN JUNE AT EXCELSIOR WORKS
