Ingleside Police Station is partnering with the San Francisco Police Academy (350 Amber Drive) to host National Night Out (NNO) on Tuesday, August 7th, 2018 from 6PM-8PM. This coming Tuesday marks the 35th anniversary of NNO, where it is expected that 38.5 million people over 16,500 communities will join forces to promote police-community partnerships, to strategize on crime, drug, and violence prevention, to enhance safety, and to inspire neighborhood unity. 2:06pm 3300 Blk. Mission Aggravated Assault

A call of a drunk and belligerent woman destroying items in a store prompted dispatch to send Ingleside Officers Chan and Klaib to investigate. As they arrived on scene they found the suspect walking in the middle of Mission Street. She was quickly placed in custody. Store officials told the officers the inebriated suspect entered the premises and was told to leave. Instead of leaving, she took out a metal pipe and swung it at employees and at the shelves. She missed the employees, but did connect with several shelves tumbling items to the ground. She was arrested for aggravated assault and other charges and driven to Ingleside Station for booking. Serious Incidents:

4:00pm 5200 Blk. Mission Robbery

Ingleside Officers Demkowski and Smith were dispatched to investigate a particularly violent robbery of a restaurant. When they arrived, restaurant employees told the officers that a woman suspect entered the restaurant and asked about an item on the menu. She then walked around the counter and pushed an employee back toward a refrigerator which was near the cash register. The suspect then placed an arm against the neck of one of the employees while reaching for the cash register which fell to the floor. The suspect then kicked the cash register several times in an unsuccessful attempt to open it. After several kicks the suspect abandoned her attempt to steal the contents and fled the premises. 11:00pm Murray and Holly Park Robbery

A man walked into Ingleside Station and informed Police Services Aide Dugan that he was the victim of an attempted robbery. The victim said he was walking southbound on Holly Park Circle, near Murray, when two men approached and demanded his property while implying the presence of a gun in his pocket. The victim said he quickly turned and ran away to his home a few blocks away and fortunately the suspects didn't follow. Report number: 180561613

A Walgreens employee thought one shopper looked suspicious as the suspect stuffed several boxes of "Butterfingers" candy bars into his backpack. The suspect then quickly left the store dropping several of the candy boxes on the floor. The employee followed the suspect out of the store to the intersection of Geneva and London where the suspect, seeing the employee, flashed a gun at him telling him to "back off". Three friends crossing the street in the crosswalk were almost hit by a speeding car. A young woman walked into a Walgreens to pick up some health and beauty products. But, she had no interest in paying for the items. The store manager, watching as she headed for the front door, intercepted her and struggled to keep the thief from leaving. The struggle ended when the woman took out a knife and threatened the employee. She escaped but not for long. Ingleside Officers Watts and Wynkoop found the suspect hiding in a doorway on the 800 block of San Jose Avenue. She still had the stolen items with her. The store manager positively identified the suspect as the robber and she was transported to the Juvenile Justice Center for booking. Report number: 180553121

6:00pm Bosworth and Chilton Aggravated Assault

A violent road rage incident ended with one of the combatants under arrest. It started with one driver cutting off another driver while both were driving on Bosworth. Words were exchanged and hand threats were flashed until both drivers pulled over near Bosworth and Chilton. Once out of the car the drivers continued their angry exchange, which escalated into a pushing match, a dented bumper, a dented hood, and one driver trying to stop the other driver from driving away by sitting on his hood. Fortunately, witnesses used their cellphones to record the battle and, Ingleside Officers Wise and Hensel, after viewing the video, arrested one of the combatants for aggravated assault and hit and run. A records check revealed the male combatant was on probation out of San Francisco for disturbing the peace. He, and his female companion, were also suspects in a theft that occurred a few days earlier and a search of the vehicle revealed a BB gun and other items used by suspects when committing robberies. A man having an early morning smoke in the Crocker Amazon Parking Lot on Moscow Street was a robbery victim. When the victim said he only had \$60, the suspect told him to drive to a nearby ATM at a gas station to get cash. On the way to the gas station the victim collided with another car at Alemany and Ocean. A woman walking home was suddenly confronted by a man who rushed her from behind.
