### Arrests:

#### **Recovered Vehicle**

A late model Chevrolet, with paper plates, caught the attention of Ingleside Officers Guernsey and Mora. The officers activated their emergency lights and pulled the vehicle over. The woman driver didn't have her license or insurance and registration for the car. She said she just bought it. However, a computer check revealed the Chevy was stolen from an Avis rental parking lot in South San Francisco along with other vehicles and several sets of car keys. The driver also had a record of several arrests and two \$35,000 warrants for felony vandalism, attempted robbery, and giving false information to a police officer. She was arrested at the scene and transported to Ingleside Station for booking. Three other occupants inside of the car also had extensive criminal records. #### **D.U.I**

Witnesses called police after seeing the driver of a car collide with two parked vehicles. Ingleside Officer Demkowski and Smith arrived and talked to the driver of the Mitsubishi Montero which collided with the parked cars. The driver showed obvious signs of intoxication and was unable to exit the vehicle without assistance. He had droopy eyes and his breath smelled of alcohol. He complained of pain and was taken to San Francisco General for assessment. At the hospital the officers were able to get a warrant for a blood alcohol test which was administered at the hospital. The employees saw the suspects stealing the items while viewing security footage. A road rage incident in the Castro district where one driver threatened another and displayed a firearm, ended up with an arrest in the Ingleside District. A minor traffic accident after midnight prompted the dispute and, because of the nature of the crime, a citywide bulletin was issued to all officers to be on the lookout for a late model Jeep Compass. Ingleside Officers Peralta and Chan spotted the Jeep parked at Mission and Persia. The officers called for backup and several Ingleside units responded to the scene. A late model Mercedes Benz, with paper plates, parked in the Safeway parking lot, caught the attention of Ingleside Officers Espinoza and Chan. The owner made several suspicious moves while driving the car out of the lot and the officers decided to stop and talk to the driver. A records check revealed he was a felon with several convictions who was on probation with a search condition. He also had a can of pepper spray on him which is prohibited by his parole. A dispute over a washing machine led to the arrest of one customer at a laundromat. The employee told Ingleside Officers Mora and Guernsey that a woman customer asked her for a quarter claiming a washing machine stole her money. When the replacement quarter didn't work either, the customer became upset and tried to steal money from the laundromat's drop box. ## Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT)



Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



## What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

### Pathways to ALERT membership:

1. Complete NERT training and receive certification. To register for NERT training courses, please visit [www.sfgov.org/sfnert](http://www.sfgov.org/sfnert). Once NERT Certified, forward a copy of your NERT ID card to the ALERT program at [sfpdalert@sfgov.org](mailto:sfpdalert@sfgov.org). After clearing our background check, you are eligible for ALERT training.
2. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, you are eligible for ALERT training after clearing our background check.

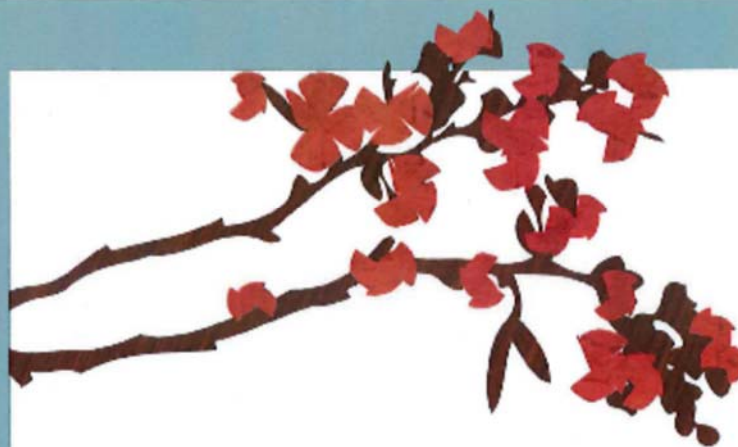


