With 2018 officially at a close and 2019 a bright new year ahead of us, I wanted to share some promising crime statistics.

Compared to 2017, 2018 showed a decline in crime in all categories, except arsons (but we did catch the suspect associated with the increase).

Please see the stats below for a year to year comparison in major areas for the Richmond District.

OFFICERS OF THE MONTH OFFICER TURNER AND OFFICER KEATING

The San Francisco Police Department Medal of Valor Award ceremony took place on November 14, 2018. Two Officers from Richmond Station were honored for their courage, tenacity, and professionalism necessary to accomplish their mission to serve and protect.



In April 2017, Officer Turner and several other officers responded to a call of a suicidal person. The subject refused to comply with officers orders and a physical altercation ensued. The subject choked one of the officers unconscious and attempted to take another officer's gun. Officers where eventually able to gain control and take the suspect into custody.

Officer Turner was awarded the Silver Medal of Valor and a Purple Heart.

In July 2017, Officer Keating and other officers responded to a call of shots fired. The suspect barricaded himself inside the residence and told officers he had shot his mother. Officers negotiated the release of the mother. Officer Keating and others then carried her a city block to where medical was staged to render aid.

Officer Keating was awarded the Bronze Medal of Valor.

While at Cassava, check out the four course tasting menu or the Japanese Breakfast, which won the best weekday breakfast by San Francisco magazine in 2018.





INCIDENTS IN THE RICHMOND DISTRICT THIS WEEK

Vehicle Burglary Arrest 12/29/18 15:00 Stow Lake Dr/ JFK Dr.

Officers spotted a known suspect casing cars with an accomplice. The suspects then broke the rear window of the victims vehicle, stole several items, and immediately fled the area on foot. Officers observed the suspects discarding stolen property as they ran. Officers attempted to detain the suspects but they continued to flee.

Additional units responded to a trespassing call where the suspects were located hiding under a car.

Robbery, Terrorists Threats Arrest 12/30/18 17:30 3000 Block Geary Blvd

Suspect 1 got in an argument with two Victims regarding change due on a gas purchase and two bags of chips. Suspect 1 and Victim 1 then struggled with the money tray tugging back and forth until the suspect was successful in opening the tray and stealing two bags of chips. During the struggle, Suspect 2 attempted to gain entry into the booth via the side door but was unsuccessful. Both Suspects threatened to return and shoot the victims. Suspect 2 gestured toward his waistband as if he had a gun. Both suspects then fled in a vehicle.

Richmond Officers broadcasted the description of the vehicle and both suspects. Northern units spotted the vehicle and conducted a felony stop.

The suspects were positively identified by the victim and placed under arrest.

Suspect 1 was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Robbery, Probation Violation, Threats







San Francisco Police Make Arrests In Chinese Community "Blessing Scam" Incidents

Two Women Arrested in Los Angeles Attempting to Flee to China Following Extortion of Over \$180,000 in Cash and Jewelry

The San Francisco Police Department is investigating several incidents involving a blessing scam targeting older members of the Chinese community. Such scams usually involve strangers claiming to provide relief from a curse or an illness, or providing "purification" ceremonies in which cash and valuable items must be offered as part of the process.

Between November 29th, 2018 and December 14th, 2018 four blessing scams were reported to the San Francisco Police Department with a loss totaling over \$180,000.00 dollars in cash and jewelry. San Francisco Police and San Francisco District Attorney's Office investigators, with the cooperation of multiple outside law enforcement agencies, identified and arrested two suspects.

On December 24th 2018, 51 year-old Mudi Wu and 45 year-old Fuxi Dai, both of China, were arrested at Los Angeles International Airport where they were attempting to flee to China. The suspects were transported back to San Francisco where they were interviewed and booked on grand theft, petty theft, extortion and elder abuse charges.

The SFPD would like to thank members of the public who provided evidence which helped lead to the arrest of the suspects. The department gratefully acknowledges its collaboration with the San Francisco District Attorney's Office and the assistance of the Los Angeles Police Department, U.S. Customs and Border Protection and Los Angeles Airport Police.

Although arrests have been made, this is an ongoing case. Due to pending identification matters, booking photos are not available at this time. Investigators are asking anyone with information on this case to contact the San Francisco Police anonymously at 415-575-4444 or text-a-tip to TIP411 with SFPD at the start of the message.

The San Francisco Police Department urges members of the Chinese community to be suspicious of such offers from strangers. Potential victims are strongly advised to contact police immediately if confronted with such a situation. Family members and caregivers to elder Chinese community members should discuss this scam with them and instruct the elders to call them if anyone approaches them under similar circumstances.

San Francisco Safety Awareness For Everyone (SFSAFE) - a program of San Francisco Police Department's Community Engagement Division - provides the City's diverse communities with safety tips and educational brochures in multiple languages. A Chinese language blessing scam flyer is attached to this news release.

Do not let strangers touch you.


Do not withdraw money at banks with strangers.
