Application for The Sherman Block Supervisory Leadership Institute (SBSLI)

SBLI applicants must meet the following POST criteria:

- Currently serve as a full-time, first-level supervisory peace officer (Sergeant).
- Have at least two years of full-time supervisory experience overseeing peace officer employees.
- Have completed the POST Supervisory Course or an equivalent or possess a POST Supervisory Certificate.
- Agree to remain employed in law enforcement for at least five years after completing SBSLI.

Interested members must submit a memorandum of interest via email to and CC their Commanding Officer within 21 days of this notice. The memorandum shall outline the applicant's interest and confirm that they meet and agree to the POST criteria outlined in this notice. As spots are filled on a first-come, first-served basis, interested members are encouraged to apply as soon as possible. Please do not sign up for this course directly through POST. Members will be notified of the approval or denial of their request via email and will receive the original copy of their memorandum.
